## Roulette

The object of the game is to place a wager on the numbered red, green or black compartments of the revolving Roulette wheel where the Player thinks a small ball (spun in the opposite direction) will come to rest. The bets are placed on the Roulette table marked to correspond with the compartments on the wheel.

### The Wheel

Marked on the Roulette wheel are the numbers 1 through 36 and the symbol "0" and "00". Each number has a corresponding color, either red or black. The symbols "0" and "00" however, are colored in green.



### The Chips

Unlike other casino chips, the value of Roulette chips are decided upon by the Player at the time of purchase. To avoid confusion on the table layout, each player receives different colored chips.

### Placing Your Bet

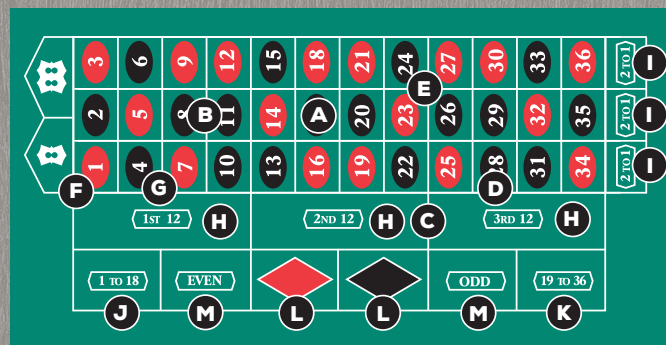
Wagering in Roulette is a snap. Bets can be placed on individual numbers, groups of numbers, a specific color on the wheel or whether the winning number turns out to be odd or even.

As bets are being placed, the dealer spins the Roulette ball in the opposite direction of the spinning wheel. Wagers may be placed until the dealer announces "no more bets".

At this time, all there's left to do is wait for the ball to land on a number. Once it does, the dealer places a marker on the winning number and pays the winning wagers. If you have any questions, the Roulette dealer or floor personnel will be happy to help!

### Roulette Rules

1. The House accepts no responsibility for chips or cash left on the gaming tables.
2. Decisions by the management are final on all games.
3. Ball location will override electronic discrepancies.



#### The following table illustrates the payoffs for single chip bets and the many combinations available:

<b>A</b>	Straight-Up Bet	Play any number including 0 or 00	Pays 35 to 1
<b>B</b>	Split Bet	Covers both numbers	Pays 17 to 1
<b>C</b>	Courtesy Line Bet	Covers the split between 0 & 00	Pays 17 to 1
<b>D</b>	Street Bet	Covers the three number across	Pays 11 to 1
<b>E</b>	Corner Bet	Covers four adjoining numbers	Pays 8 to 1
<b>F</b>	Top Line	Covers 0, 00, 1, 2 & 3 only	Pays 6 to 1
<b>G</b>	Line Bet	Covers six numbers across	Pays 5 to 1
<b>H</b>	Twelve numbers or section bets	Covers all twelve numbers in that section	Pays 2 to 1
<b>I</b>	Row	Covers all twelve numbers in that row	Pays 2 to 1
<b>J</b>	One to Eighteen	Pays even money or 1 to 1	—
<b>K</b>	Nineteen to Thirty-Six	Pays even money or 1 to 1	—
<b>L</b>	Red or Black	Pays even money or 1 to 1	—
<b>M</b>	Odd or Even	Pays even money or 1 to 1	—
