## HOW TO PLAY BLACKJACK



### **Blackjack Rules**

1. Must be 21 years or older to play Blackjack.
2. Blackjack pays 3 to 2 on six-deck Blackjack, and 6 to 5 on single-deck Blackjack.
3. Tie hands are considered a "push" - nobody wins.
4. Dealer hits soft 17.
5. On six-deck Blackjack, hand signals are used to indicate if a player wants to draw an additional card or stand. On single-deck Blackjack, the player uses their cards to indicate if they want to draw an additional card or stand.
6. Players may "double down" on any first two cards.
7. "Splitting" is permitted up to four hands, except aces, which receive one card each.
8. The House accepts no responsibility for chips or cash left on the gaming tables.
9. Players are expected to conduct themselves in an orderly manner.
10. Table limits are posted on all games.
11. No cellular phones to be used at table games.
12. Seven Feathers Casino Resort reserves the right to refuse service to anyone.

## Blackjack

Two cards are dealt to each player and the dealer. The player's cards are dealt face up when six decks of cards are used, and face down when one deck of cards is used. One of the dealer's cards is dealt face up and the other face down.

The object of the game is to draw cards to a total of 21, or closer to 21 than the dealer. The ten, jack, queen and king count as ten points each; the other cards count at their face value – aces can count as one or eleven points.

If the first two cards of a hand consist of an ace with any ten, jack, queen or king it is a "blackjack". On the six-deck game, it is paid at one and one-half times the amount wagered, unless the dealer also had a blackjack. In this case it is a "push". A "push" is when neither the dealer nor the player wins. On the single-deck game, blackjacks are paid odds of 6 to 5, unless the dealer also has a blackjack. In this case, the player's bet would be a push.

If you do not have a blackjack, you may indicate to the dealer to "hit" you. This means to give you another card.

- You may draw as many cards as you like (one at a time) to improve your hand, but if you go over 21, you have "busted" and, consequently, lose your wager. If you do not want a "hit" (you have drawn as many cards as you desire), then you may indicate to the dealer you would like to "stand".
- You may "double down" (double your original wager) to receive one card on any two original cards dealt, or the two cards of a split hand.
- You may "split" any two cards with the same face value by making a wager equal to the original wager. With the exception of split aces, you may "double down" after "splitting".
- You may split cards up to four times, except aces, which can only receive one card each.

## Side Bets

In addition to the regular blackjack games, two side bets are offered on the six-deck Blackjack games:

### Royal Match Game Basics

Royal Match is an optional bonus bet for blackjack that considers the player's first two cards. If the cards are the same suit, or a Royal Match (King and Queen suited), the player wins.

#### Playing the Game

1. To begin each round, the player makes a standard blackjack wager and the optional Royal Match wager.
2. The dealer then follows house procedures for blackjack.
3. Once the player has two cards, the dealer settles the Royal Match wagers. If the player has two suited cards, they win according to the posted pay table. If the player's first two cards are not suited, they lose.

<b>Hand</b>	<b>Payout</b>
Two suited cards	2 to 1
Royal Match (suited King and Queen)	50 to 1

### Bet the Set Game Basics

Bet the Set is an optional bonus bet for blackjack that considers the first two cards a player receives. If the cards are a pair or a suited pair, the player wins.

#### Playing the Game

1. To begin each round, the player makes a standard blackjack wager and the optional Bet the Set wager.
2. The dealer then follows house procedures for blackjack.
3. Once the player has two cards, the dealer settles the Bet the Set wagers. If the player has a pair, they win according to the posted pay table. If the player's first two cards are not a pair, they lose.

<b>Hand</b>	<b>Payout</b>
Regular pair	10 to 1
Suited pair	15 to 1
