BACCARAT

If you haven't played baccarat before, you may be surprised by how easy it is. In some ways, it's like betting Heads or Tails on a coin toss.

In baccarat, the choices are Player or Banker. The Banker wins slightly more often than the Player. Winning Banker hands are charged a 5% commission.

Sometimes, neither the Player nor the Banker wins. This is called a Tie. In the event of a Tie, the Player and Banker bets "push" (they don't win or lose). Winning Tie bets are paid 8 to 1.

The scoring in baccarat is easy. Each card has a point value. Tens, Jacks, Queens, and Kings count as a zero. Aces count as 1, 2s count as 2, 3s count as 3, etc.

The Player and Banker hands will each receive a total of two or three cards, depending on the rules shown below. To calculate the score for a hand, the Dealer adds the cards together. Nine is the highest score possible. If the total is higher than ten, the first number is subtracted. For example, if a 7 and 10 are dealt, the total is 7.

If either the Player or the Banker has a total of 8 or 9 with their first two cards, no more cards will be drawn. This is known as a Natural.

After the cards have been dealt, the total for the Player and the total for the Banker are compared. The highest total wins. If both totals are equal, it's a Tie.

Rules

The Player's cards are always acted on first:

If the Player's first two cards total:	Player will:
0 through 5	Draw another card, unless Banker has a Natural.
6 or 7	Stand.
8 or 9	Stand. No more cards to either hand. It's a Natural.

After the Player has acted, it's the Banker's turn:

If either the Player or the Banker has a Natural, no other cards will be drawn.

If the Player took NO third card, the Banker will draw another card if their first two cards total 0 through 5. They will stand if their first two cards total 6 through 9.

Otherwise, the Banker will follow these rules:

If the Banker's first two cards total:	Banker will:
0 through 2	Draw another card.
3	Draw another card, UNLESS Player's third card is an 8.
4	Draw another card if Player's third card is 2 through 7.
5	Draw another card if Player's third card is 4 through 7.
6	Draw another card if Player's third card is 6 or 7.
7	Stands.
8 or 9	No more cards to either hand. It's a Natural.

DRAGON BONUS

Rules

How To Play Dragon Bonus® is an optional wager for baccarat that pays when your hand is a natural winner or wins by a large margin. The highest payout is for a non-natural that wins by nine points.

Getting Started Make the Dragon Bonus wager by betting in the marked area. You may bet the Dragon Bonus wager for the Player, the Banker or bet them both. You must make a standard Player or Banker wager to play Dragon Bonus.

Winning and Losing You have two ways to win:

- 1) When your hand is a natural winner
- 2) When your non-natural hand wins by at least four points

Payouts

Natural Winners	1 to 1
Natural Ties	Push
Non-Natural Winners	Win by 4 thru 9 points

BANKER PAIR - PLAYER PAIR

Rules

How To Play Banker Pair and Player Pair are optional side bets for baccarat. Banker Pair wins if the first two cards in the Banker hand are a pair. Player Pair wins if the first two cards in the Player hand are a pair. Note: pairs are exact rank cards only. Jack-King is not a pair. King-King, and Jack-Jack are.

Getting Started Make the Banker Pair or Player Pair bet by betting in the marked area. Players may wager on either the Player Pair, the Banker Pair, or both. You must have a standard Player or Banker wager to play a Pair bet. The dealer then follows house procedures for Baccarat.

Winning and Losing If you have a wager on the Banker Pair and the first two cards in the Banker hand are a pair, you win. If you have a wager on the Player Pair and the first two cards in the Player hand are a pair, you win.

Payouts

Banker pair	11 to 1
Player pair	11 to 1
